

What is a supported internship?

Supported Internships are a structured study programme based primarily at an employer. They enable young people aged 16-24 with an Education, Health and Care plan to achieve sustainable paid employment by equipping them with the skills they need for work, through learning in the workplace. Supported internships are unpaid and last for a minimum of six months. Wherever possible, they support the young person to move into paid employment at the end of the programme.

Alongside their time at the employer, young people complete a personalised study programme which includes the chance to study for relevant substantial qualifications if appropriate, and English and Maths.

Over the years, supported internships in Gloucestershire have increased in popularity with each of our 3 providers, Gloucestershire College, SGS College and National Star College (Greensteps).

Over 120 employers are involved which students will have access to which allows for a more variety of suitable placements leading to sustainable employment. This programme is a fantastic opportunity for young people with barriers to progress out of education and on the road to more independent lives.

What is transition chat?



Transition chat is led by Young Gloucestershire. The purpose of the service is to work with young people in Year 11, who are at risk of being Not in Employment, Education or Training (NEET) following their secondary school education.

The service supports young people who may have faced a variety of barriers or challenges stopping them from moving onto their next educational steps or they may not know what they would like to do next.

Once a referral has been reviewed and agreed to progress, Young Gloucestershire will assign a youth worker to the young person who will meet with them and schedule regular individual sessions. The sessions will offer a person-centred approach to meeting the young person's needs and also their aspirations.

The allocated youth worker will support the young person up until the point where they transition into post 16 provision, unless it is mutually agreed at an earlier stage that this service is no longer required.









What is LMI?

Labour Market Information (LMI) is the name for facts and figures about jobs and employment.

The information is used to give an overall picture of the past, present and future of work. The **labour market** is the term used to describe the amount of people working and looking for work, and the number of jobs.

LMI provides the knowledge and understanding of how the labour market functions and is crucial for making sense of changing economic circumstances.

It can also help when thinking about what the future might hold, so can support informed career decision making.

An aspiring Journalism student participated in a 1-1 video meeting with a BBC Journalist.


The student prepared questions and made notes on the advice they were given.
