



What is LMI?

Labour Market Information (LMI) is the name for facts and figures about jobs and employment.

The information is used to give an overall picture of the past, present and future of work. The labour market is the term used to describe the amount of people working and looking for work, and the number of jobs.

LMI provides the knowledge and understanding of how the labour market functions and is crucial for making sense of changing economic circumstances.

It can also help when thinking about what the future might hold, so can support informed career decision making.

There will be more sessions scheduled before July.


International Day of Women and Girls in Science On February 11th


