Some of our students have been helping to deliver this year's batch of lambs at Acton Mill Care Farm. Such a wonderful experience for them to be part of.

We were so proud of the students who achieved their Duke of Edinburgh Award last summer and I am looking forward seeing a new group of students complete their community work and their required expedition this year.

Even with the Covid-19 pandemic in full swing last academic year our students achieved our most significant results ever, with 227 examinations being passed. The challenge this year is to see if we can match or even exceed this.

It is wonderful to see our students engaging in academic and vocational activities in addition to all the off-site activities and out-door learning opportunities we offer. None of this would happen without the support of our students' parents and carers. So, a big thank you must be extended to you. We strive to change the life opportunities for our students and make their learning journey with us enjoyable, effective and purposeful.

## Science is exciting at Norton College Worcester!


With an emphasis on practical skills at all levels, the aim is to show that Science is fun and engaging.

Younger students participate in short practical sessions where they learn basic safety and Science skills through experimentation and practice. Popular practicals include making model lungs, dissecting hearts and experimenting with electrical circuits. We aim to follow the interests of the students.

Entry Level students have the chance to show off their developing skills by demonstrating how to use more challenging scientific equipment such as microscopes, chemicals and electronics.

For GCSE we have invested in new specialised equipment ranging from alkali metals for explosive reactions and burettes and pipettes for titrations so students can experience the full range of scientific experiments. Recent practicals include burning magnesium, reacting metals with acid and making their own slides to view under the microscope.

A recent addition to the Science lab has been frogspawn from a local pond; students have enjoyed watching the frogspawn develop into tadpoles, and then eventually into frogs. These will then be released back into their natural habitat. This has led to interesting conversations about food chains, nutrition, and life cycles.

### Water sports at Upton Warren

As the weather starts to improve over the summer term, our access to water based activities increases. These activities include Aquapark, kayaking, paddle boarding etc and are available to all our students. Students thrive when they access these activities.

If students would like to access this provision, we ask that you ensure they have appropriate clothing (wet suits are provided by college), hats, towels and sun cream. If there are any individual requests please contact the college office who will liaise with the water sports team.

## Careers

The careers support that our students have access to is important to allow them to raise their aspirations and progress into adulthood. They can access careers information, advice and guidance from various avenues including PSHE lessons, careers curriculum, subject specific careers information in subject areas, career databases and 1:1 career support.

In line with government guidance, we have a Level 6 careers adviser who is registered with the Careers Development Institute, to ensure all our students receive impartial careers advice. If parents wish to discuss any areas of careers advice or progression, with our careers adviser, they are welcome to call college, at any time, to arrange a discussion.
