# BTEC Sport

## Level 2

BTEC Sport Level 1/2 is a practical, hands-on course for learners who enjoy being active and want to develop their skills in sport. Students take part in a range of units, including Practical Sports Performance, where they build their ability across different sports, and the Unit 1 exam, which develops their knowledge of fitness and training.

They also complete Fitness for Sport and Exercise, designing and reviewing their own fitness programmes, and Sports Leadership, where they plan and lead activities for others.

Throughout the course, learners develop key skills such as teamwork, communication and leadership, preparing them for further study or careers in sport.

# Art

## Arts Award Bronze/Silver



Arts Award Bronze and Silver help students develop creativity, confidence and independence through art. They explore a range of artists, styles and techniques while building practical skills in areas such as drawing, painting and graffiti.

Students create personal projects, research artists and arts opportunities, and learn to review and evaluate their work. They also share their creativity through presentations, exhibitions or workshops.

Silver further develops leadership and research skills. Ideal for students interested in art and the creative industries, these courses support creativity, communication and independent learning.

This course is ideal for students interested in a career in Art and Design. It can lead to Level 3 Art, A Level Art, Arts Award Gold or T Levels in Digital Production and Illustration.

Career routes include roles in media, advertising, publishing, journalism and animation.

University pathways include Fine Art, Graphic Design, Advertising, Set Design and specialist creative courses.

# Music

## Arts Award Bronze/Silver

In Music Arts Award, you'll explore, create and discuss all things musical while developing your performing, composing, listening and appraising skills. You'll study the work of a range of musicians, try different instruments and discover new styles of music you may not have heard before.

There will be opportunities to attend live performances both in school and at local venues, as well as plan and lead sessions to help other pupils develop their own musical skills. The course is flexible, inclusive and suitable for all musical interests, making it a fun and engaging way to learn about music. Alongside this, you can also work towards Trinity College music development qualifications—nationally recognised awards ranging from Entry Level 1 to Level 2.

# Duke of Edinburgh

## Bronze/Silver Award

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award is a unique qualification that combines physical activity, voluntary work, and skill development into one comprehensive programme. Students have the freedom to choose their voluntary work, the skills they wish to develop, and the physical activities they want to take part in throughout the year. Activities may include rock climbing, sailing, canoeing, high ropes, archery, and more.

Assessment takes place throughout the year as students complete the three sections of the programme. The course concludes with an expedition, where students camp off-site with staff support, putting their skills to the test in a real-world setting. This award is a well-respected and well-known course across the country because of the number of skills students develop and the experience it provides.

## Entry Level / GCSE

The course develops a range of valuable skills, including analysing evidence, evaluating different viewpoints and writing clear, well-structured arguments.

History is designed to be engaging and accessible, allowing you to build confidence at your own level while developing your knowledge and independence. It also supports wider personal development by encouraging curiosity, empathy and an understanding of different cultures and perspectives

# Geography

## Entry Level / GCSE

Entry Level and GCSE Geography give you the opportunity to explore the world around you and understand how people, places and environments are connected. You will study a range of real-life topics such as climate change, natural hazards, population and global development, helping you make sense of current global issues. Through both courses, you will develop important skills including map work, data analysis, fieldwork, problem-solving and teamwork. The courses are designed to be engaging and accessible, allowing you to build confidence at your own level while developing independence. Geography also supports progression onto further study and links to a wide range of future pathways, particularly in areas such as the environment, business, travel and public services.

# Construction

## BTEC Level 1



This course is a hands-on, practical pathway into the construction industry, perfect for learners who enjoy learning by doing. Students experience a wide range of construction activities, helping them discover their strengths and interests within the trade.

Blending elements of art, maths and science, the course builds a strong link between academic learning and real-world skills. Learners get the opportunity to develop their abilities in bricklaying, woodwork, and painting and decorating, gaining valuable experience that prepares them for further training or a future career in construction.

# BTEC Esports

## Level 2

This qualification allows students to explore their creativity in the digital world. They will learn about what it takes to build a gaming organisation and have the opportunity to plan/develop their own Esports brand. In today's rapidly evolving digital age, gaming companies are constantly striving to provide users with the most immersive experiences possible. Students will study emerging trends in gaming, including the rise of online gaming and streaming, and examine their impact on the industry.

## Where this subject can take you

A BTEC Level 2 in Esports can lead to further education, apprenticeships or careers in the growing digital and media industries. Students can progress onto Level 3 courses, or move into pathways such as digital media, IT, business or creative qualifications. The course helps develop skills in teamwork, communication, organisation and technology, which can support future roles in areas such as event planning, marketing, content creation or IT support.

# Drama

## Arts Award Bronze/Silver



Arts Award is a nationally recognised qualification where students develop their drama skills through performance, theatre visits and exploring the work of practitioners. They build a portfolio to record their work and progress.

At Bronze, students take part in drama activities, review performances and share their skills. At Silver, students work more independently, completing a drama project and taking on a leadership role.

The course builds confidence, creativity, communication and teamwork, supporting progression into further study in Drama.
